Lenten Rules for Fasting and

Abstinence: Catholics age 18-59 are obligated to fast on Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from meat on Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. If one is in good health and is not in the above categories, they too are encouraged to follow the above rules.

Parish Lenten Project: Our Parish Lenten Project this year will be twofold. First we will use some of the funds for repairing the roof at St. Joseph Rectory, and secondly some of the proceeds will go to support the Sandwich Ministry Program. 
